#### **Got Sneakers?**

Since sneakers are manufactured with materials that are not biodegradable, they remain in landfills or are incinerated which leads to toxic chemicals in our air and soil.

### THE READING CORNER

Here are a few book recommendations for our young readers.

#### <u>Sports:</u>

*Ghost* by Jason Reynolds Ghost is a talented runner who joins a track team and faces challenges related to his past and family. The story emphasizes perseverance and self-discovery.

#### Fantasy/Magic:

The Girl Who Drank the Moon by Kelly Barnhill Luna, a girl fed moonlight instead of starlight, discovers her magical powers while learning about her past and the world around her. It explores themes of love and choice.

**<u>History:</u>** No Better Friend: Two Dogs, One Mission, and a Very Different Way of Life by John O'Brien This true story follows the bond between a soldier and a stray dog named Rex during the Vietnam War. As they navigate the challenges of war, their friendship highlights themes of loyalty, courage, and companionship.

#### <u>Growing Up:</u>

When you Catch a Tiger by Tae Keller This award-winning novel follows Lily, a girl who returns to her Korean heritage and faces family struggles after her grandmother becomes ill. When Lily encounters a tiger from a folktale, she must confront her fears and uncover the stories that connect her to her family and culture.

#### **Mystery:**

The Westing Game by Ellen Raskin Sixteen heirs must solve clues in a millionaire's will to win his fortune, filled with twists and quirky characters that challenge readers to unravel the mystery.

# **Health and Wellness Matters**

## **Gratitude Journaling**

All Eagle Hill students are invited to sign up for gratitude journaling with Angelique during enrichment period 11/18 - 11/21. Each participant should bring a journal (or composition books will be provided). During this session, we will practice some light meditation, and spend the rest of our time focusing on gratitude and journaling. The goal of these sessions is to inspire attendees to incorporate gratitude journaling as a daily practice. Students were invited via email to sign up.

After an initial presentation, attendees participated in breakout sessions for engaging discussions. The next meet up in December will cover chapters 1-4 of the book with other FM community members.

## **Halloween Hustle**


Our 2nd annual fun run was a huge success! Runners enjoyed fantastic weather, and at the end refueled with cider and donuts. Thank you to all of our participants!

## **Sheet Tray Maple Cinnamon**

## **Trail Mix**

Ingredients for 6 servings

- 1 cup pumpkin seeds
- 1 cup walnuts, chopped
- 1 cup raw almond, whole, unsalted
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 3 tablespoons maple syrup
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- 1 cup dried cranberry

Preparation

1 Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C).

2 In a bowl, add the pumpkin seeds, walnuts, almonds, stir to combine.

3 Transfer to a parchment paper-lined baking sheet and bake for 10 minutes.

4 Let cool completely, then toss with cranberries. Store in an airtight container for up to 1 week.

Here are just a few questions we have been getting lately.

## What is the Enrichment Period?

Enrichment period is a short amount of time after school where students can participate in a number of opportunities. Clubs, after school help with school, and other social enrichment can be provided. Information on the schedule can be found in Schoology. There is a form students must fill out to let school know they are staying after. There are buses to bring them home or you can pick them up in the auditorium circle.

## Can I start a Club?

Yes! A club needs at least 10 interested students and a teacher willing to host the club. A club can be about anything, within reason. The principal must approve the club.


